NT Unit: A King Like No Other, Lesson 3

D6 Family Theme:
THE RISEN KING

Objectives:

Know: An angel rolled back the stone, revealing that Jesus was not in the tomb. He had risen from the dead.

Think: Be confident in my faith, knowing there is good evidence for the Resurrection.

Do: Worship the risen Savior and spread the good news.



READ: LISTEN TO GOD

Read Matthew 28:1-15. Although many in our culture doubt and dismiss it, the resurrection of Christ is arguably the most meaningful event of human history. In this text, you will see how the events of the Resurrection unfolded.



PRAY: TALK TO GOD

We continue to proclaim that Christ is risen from the dead despite those who claim otherwise. Pray that you and your family will be brave in sharing your faith with friends, family, and neighbors.



DO: WALK WITH GOD

Option 1: On the third day after Jesus was crucified, Mary Magdalene and Mary went to see Jesus' body, but all they found was an angel who told them Jesus is alive! Bake a treat with your child. Get a can of crescent rolls, marshmallows, a cinnamon/sugar mixture, and melted butter. Have your child dip the marshmallows (Jesus' body) into the melted butter and then the cinnamon/sugar mixture (the oils and spices His body was anointed with when He was buried.) Lay the marshmallow on the dough (the tomb) and roll it up, pinching the seams. Bake the rolls according to the package. Once they are done, your child will see that the tomb is empty (the marshmallow is gone)!

Option 2: Visit a local Christian bookstore or www.christianbook.com and order a set of "Resurrection Eggs." If you can't find them, you can also make your own (Google search "Resurrection Eggs"). In this set are 12 eggs, each containing something relevant to the story of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Label the eggs 1-12. Give out the eggs to your family members and ask them not to open them until you call their number. When you are ready to begin, call out number one and ask the person to explain the significance of that object to the Resurrection story, then number two, etc. If they might not know the significance of the items in the eggs, let them open the eggs and display what is in them, and ask your whole family to explain their significance to the Resurrection. Once you've opened all 12 eggs, you have retold the Resurrection story from a simple, almost childlike point of view.
