NT Unit: A King Like No Other, Lesson 4

## D6 Family Theme: THE KING'S COMMISSION

### Objectives:

**Know:** Christ commissioned His followers to make disciples wherever He sends them.

**Think:** Live with the understanding that I am to share and teach the gospel at every opportunity, and be part of getting it to the entire world.

**Do:** Share and teach the gospel with those I come in contact with, and help send the gospel to all people groups.



### READ: LISTEN TO GOD

**Read Matthew 28:16-20; Acts 1:6-11.** The world is a much better place because of individuals that have been called to go forth with the gospel. The mandate of Scripture is for those that have heard and received the gospel to take it to others that have yet to hear.



### PRAY: TALK TO GOD

We witness to those we come in contact with and help send the gospel to all nations. Pray that you and your family will have opportunities to share God's Word and support missionaries all over the world.



### DO: WALK WITH GOD

**Option 1:** Jesus' final command to His disciples was to go into all nations and make more disciples. He promised to be with them as they taught the nations His commands. Talk with your children about the missionaries that your family might know or pick a missionary family that your church supports. Talk about the country that the missionaries live in and the people they are reaching. Have them come up with several ways that your family can pray for those missionaries. Explain to them that it is important to reach the nations, but it is just as important to reach our community. Encourage your children to be missionaries in your neighborhood and their schools.

**Option 2:** Read a biography or a summary of a biography of a missionary with your family. If you don't know of any in particular, consider someone such as Jim Elliott, Lottie Moon, Hudson Taylor, or Thomas and Mabel Willey (Mom and Pop Willey). Individuals such as these provide great encouragement for us to live lives of obedience to the Lord (Hebrews 12:1). Ask this question: *What compelled them to go when others would stay?*

Remind your teen of the importance of sharing the gospel with unbelievers and encourage your son or daughter to get involved with mission efforts around the world.

The group members discussed that the mandate of Scripture for those who have heard and received the gospel is to share this good news with those that have yet to hear.



ADULT

*FUSION* groups discussed that the mandate of Scripture for those that have heard and received the gospel is to take it to others that have yet to hear. They were encouraged to make plans to share the gospel with someone they know this week, and to consider how they might be involved in helping get the gospel to other nations and people groups through going, praying, and giving.
